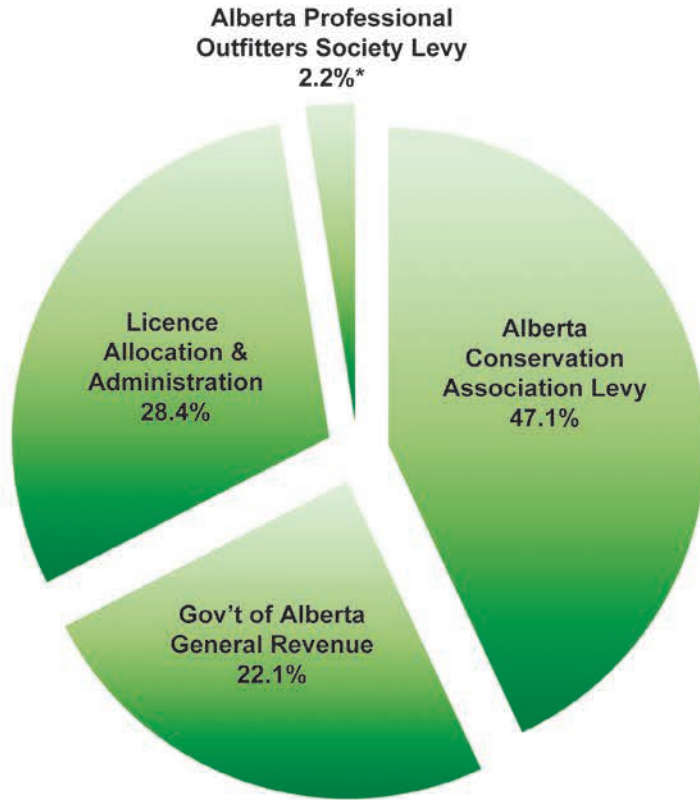


# 2015/16 ALBERTA HUNTING REPORT



## Where did your 2015/16 Hunting Licence Dollars go?

- A total of \$18.8M in revenue was collected from the sale of Hunting Licences and WiN cards.
- ACA levy increase amounted in an additional \$1.6 million to support programs.
- Licence Allocation & Administration provides compensation for the Licence Issuer and the Service provider and provides funding for Hunter Harvest and Aerial Ungulate surveys.

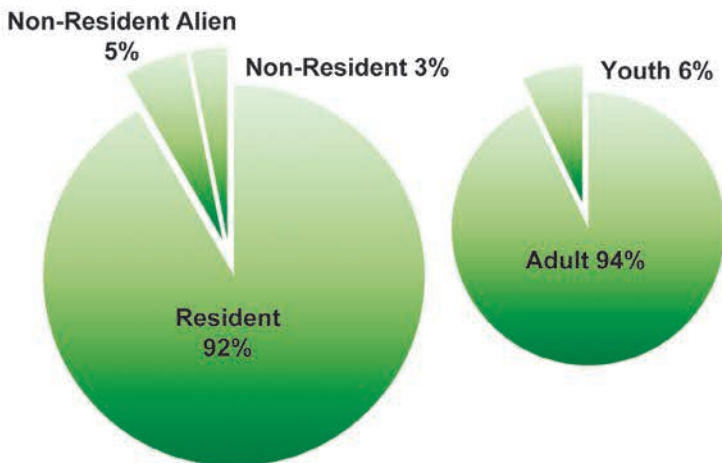
## Alberta Big Game Hunters

In 2015 over 138,000 hunters hunted in Alberta

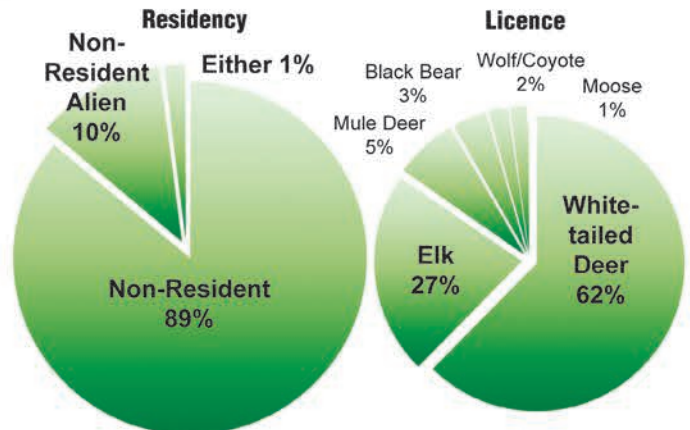


In 2015, 138,000 Albertans purchased over 344,000 hunting licences representing a 37% increase over 2014.



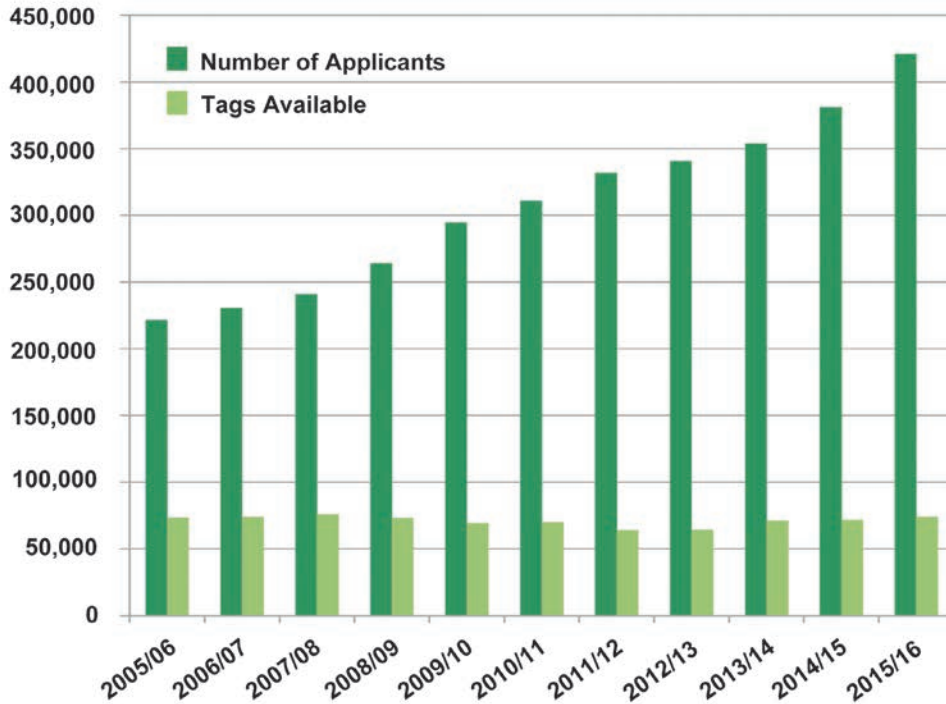
## Hunter-Hosted Activity

Nearly 3000 hunts were hosted in Alberta



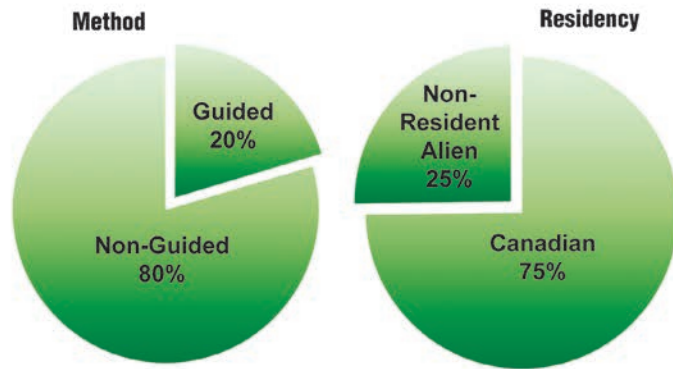

## 2015 HUNTER COMPLIANCE SUMMARY

**16,515** Hunters checked by officers which resulted in:  
**992** hunting related enforcement actions.

Did you know that in 2015, there were more than 3000 wildlife-related enforcement actions taken that also included investigations and response from calls on the Report A Poacher line.

### TOP 5 Offenses

1. Unlawful possession of wildlife
2. Loaded firearm in vehicle
3. Hunting without a licence
4. Ineligible to obtain/hold a licence
5. Fail to carry a licence while hunting
